Complaint:

About 9.0 lakh serving and retired Indian Coal Mining industry employees are covered under Coal Mines Pension Scheme 1998, framed under Coal Mines Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1948.

The scheme is administered by Board of Trustees (BoT) headed by Secretary to government, Ministry of Coal as its Ex-Officio Chairman.



 Though there is provision of 3-Yearly review/ revision of pension based on Actuarial valuation of fund corpus, there was no enhancement of pension since inception of the scheme more than 18 years ago. As a result pensioner gets the same amount of pension fixed at the time of retirement for any number of years he lives on the planet earth without a single rupee increase.



There are pensioners getting a monthly pension of ₹300 which is far less than the minimum pension of ₹1000 under similar contributory pension scheme of Employee Provident Fund (EPF) and also the old age pension scheme of central and state governments.



Because of the indecision, gross negligence and unprofessional fund management by the BoT, the pension fund under CMPS 1998 is in doldrums and the interests of pensioners are severely affected. Unless urgent corrective action is taken by BoT and ministry of coal, the sustainability of the scheme itself is doubtful.



Continued...

Due to inaction and delay tactics of BoT, the pensioners' right to live with dignity and honour in their sunset years has been grossly violated. Having spent 3 to 4 decades of working life in the most hazardous profession of coal mining, many coal mine pensioners are living a life of destitution due non revision of pension.



Cont...

The omissions and commissions of CMPF organisation under coal ministry have been seriously appraised by CAG and parliamentary standing committees on Coal and Steel, the reports of which are available in public domain



Cont...

Pray/Relief Sought:

I Pray the Honourable NHRC to give necessary direction to the ministry of Coal as a custodian of CMPFO, to urgently resolve this issue.

Grant an ad-hoc relief of ₹5000 as a minimum monthly pension to those pensioners drawing less than that amount as pension, till the issue is finalised.

Article 21 explained

'LIFE'- UNDER ARTICLE 21: The term 'life' as under Article21 of the Indian Constitution has been construed by the Hon'ble Apex Court in a liberal and comprehensive manner. Over a period of time, the Hon'ble Apex Judiciary provided an extensive interpretation to the



Cont...

In the landmark case of Francis Coralie v. Union of India, 24 the Hon'ble Apex Judiciary has decided that the term 'life' under Article 21 of the Indian Constitution cannot imply just a corporeal or animal existence or a physical existence but holds rather more concrete aspects.



Cont...

It involves the Right to live with utmost dignity to all and everything containing it. The Hon'ble Apex Court also, in the case of Shantisar Builders v. Narayanan Khimalal Totame25, upheld that the **Right to life** under Article 21 of Indian Constitution includes Right to reasonable accommodation to live in, food, decent environment and clothing.



Cont...

Hence, the notion of 'life' under Article 21 has been lavishly construed in recent and contemporary years which implies a host of all the Fundamental Rights under Part III.



5. Social media

6. Writ Petitions

Sub: Hearing in Delhi Court regarding upward revision of pension.

Delhi High Court heard on 20th Oct, 2016, the matter related to pension. Govt of India finally declined to file any reply and it was recorded by the court. CIL filed reply during proceedings of the court. We are to submit rejoinder within 14 days. Next hearing on 30th Nov. 2016.

It was heard on 30.11.2016. notice issued to SCCL for its counter. Hearing date to be allocated by the system.

Prayer in the writ petition (s) (civil) No (s). 88/2015 filed in January 2015

1) To direct the respondents to raise the pensionary benefits by neutralising 50% raise in price index from the day the retired employees are entitled to the monthly pension under the CMPS 1998 scheme, or in the alternative,

2) Directing the respondents to additionally pay such amount, in addition to the pensionable amount, as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper;



Cont...

3) Interim order and/or direction staying operation of the impugned cut off date of 01-04-1994 so as to make the coal mines pension scheme, 1998 applicable to all retired employees of the Coal Industry irrespective of date of their retirement and the respondents be further directed to pay pension to all such retired employees under the provisions of CMPS 1998 with immediate effect; and

4) Such other order and/or orders a this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case.
