Secretary's Report

Dear Member

It gives me great pleasure in presenting the General Secretary's report in the 15th Annual General Meeting of SROWA.

Following is the gist of activities of SROWA since the last AGM held on 26.12.2021:

1. Pension issue under CMPS 1998:

- The next hearing of the W.P (C) 3118/2015 pending in high court of Delhi on the issue of revision of pension under Coal Mines Pension Scheme 1998 (CMPS 1998) is on 21.11.2022. Since the last two hearings our case is represented by Sr.Advocate Shri.K.K.Roy assisted by Srivastava& company and the advocate on record Shri.Navin Prakash. In the last hearing on 13.09.2022, our case has reached a stage 'partly heard', meaning it will be heard by the same bench till the verdict is passed.
- It is also proposed to seek contribution from our members and CMOAI-SCCL branch for meeting the legal expenses.
- Our Association is continuing its efforts of meeting People's Representatives and submitting representations on the pension issue. SROWA is closely associated with Coal Mines Pensioners Association (CMPA), Hyderabad in their efforts of meeting ministers of Telangana state.
- Our association is closely liaising with All India Coal Pensioners Association (AICPA) on pension and other issues.
- SROWA office bearers participated along with CMPA in the meeting organised by AICPA on 26.06.2022 at RCOA club, Godavarikhani on pension issue to seek support for the month long dharna program proposed to be held at 'Jantar-Mantar', New Delhi from 25.07.2022.
- On the request of AICPA, few members of SROWA participated in 'Dharna' in front of Regional CMPF offices at Godavarikhani and Kothagudem on 10.10.2022 and submitted representation to the respective Regional Commissioners on revision of pension and streamlining widow/widower pension.
- It is also proposed to participate in the MAHA DHARNA at JANTAR-MANTAR, New Delhi on 05.12.2022, in response to the call given by All India Coal Pensioners Association.

pension issue and to nominate a representative of Federation of Coal Industry Retired Employees Association/All India Coal Pensioners Association as a Trustee on the Board of Trustees of CMPFO.

- The Trade Unions at SCCL level and the national level are regularly contacted to request them to take up pension issue during their negotiations for NCWA-XI.
- It is to inform the members that in the BOT meeting held on 16.08.2022, it was decided to raise the minimum pension to Rs.1000 per month and to make a contribution of Rs.15 to 20 per ton of coal produced mandatory on all companies, public sector and private. Gazette notification is awaited.
- The decision of Supreme Court bench on the EPS-1995 pension issue is also awaited, to find some favourable points in support of our case pending in Delhi high court.

2. CPRMSE:

Our Association is regularly taking up with Director (PA&W) and other officials of SCCL for hassle-free cashless treatment in the empanelled hospitals and other matters. A representation was submitted to C&MD on 15.09.2022 for processing and settlement of medical bills in respect of beneficiaries covered under CPRMSE scheme, through a third party as in CIL. It is reliably learnt that SCCL is going to issue detailed guidelines for generating life certificate for CPRMSE through Jeevan Praman portal.

3. Executive Defined Contribution Pension Scheme 2007 (EDCPS 2007):

The issue of compensatory interest on EDCPS accumulations from 01.01.2007 to the date of transferring the funds to the fund manager (LIC) was resolved in CIL recently and the amounts have been transferred to the LIC and through them to the annuity providers. SCCL is being followed up for similar action after a representation dt.16.04.2022 was submitted to C&MD and representation dt.27.08.2022 submitted to Director (PA&W)

4. Arrears of PRP (from 2007-08 to 2013-14):

Our prolonged representations to C&MD, CM's office and continuous follow up with CMOAI for over 4 years failed to resolve the issue. A group of retired executives filed a writ petition in Telangana high court on 08.03.2022, making C&MD, SCCL, Principal Secretary, Energy Department, Government of Telangana and Secretary, Coal as respondents. Case is regularly monitored.

5. Liaison with CMOAI-SCCL branch:

I am extremely happy to inform you that we are maintaining very good relationship with CMOAI-SCCL branch. On the appeal from our Association they are extending financial support to meet the legal expenses with regard to our court case on pension issue.
